Last week we had representatives from Hobsons Bay City Council and Williamstown Police in attendance to observe and monitor the crossing and it was helpful to have the opportunity to stand alongside them and explain our concerns. 




# Year 1/2 - Shape



"Splash" will be performed twice on Saturday 14th of September (1pm & 6:30pm) at John Cain Arena. Here are some photos from the rehearsal.






