## Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey

Our school is conducting the annual Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey offered by the Department of Education and is seeking your feedback. The survey is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behavior, and student engagement. The survey is optional, but we encourage and appreciate your participation.

Our school will use the survey results to assist in identifying areas for improvement and professional development needs in the school, to target school planning and improvement strategies.

The Parent / Caregiver / Guardian Opinion Survey will be open online until Friday 30 August 2024.

All families are invited to participate in the survey.

The survey will be conducted **online**, only takes approximately **20 minutes** to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. Next week families will receive a link with a PIN to complete the survey.

The online survey will be available in English and 10 other languages including Arabic, Greek, Hakha Chin, Hindi, Japanese, Punjabi, Simplified Chinese, Somali, Turkish, and Vietnamese. Resources are also available in additional languages to assist parents / caregivers / guardians who speak a language other than English at home. Please reach out to your child's teacher, or the school directly for survey guides in your language.

# House Sports Day Friday 16th August

**Some Important Information** 

**Timetable:** Events have been timetabled for Year 3 to 6 students all day and for Prep to Year 2 students

for a 2 hour block.

Students in Prep to Year 2 will leave school at 11am and return by 1.30pm. They will have recess at school prior to leaving for the track and will have their lunch when they return. They should bring a drink bottle and are welcome to bring additional snacks to have between events.

Students in Years 3 to 6 will leave school at 9am and return by approximately 3pm.

Getting There: We have booked buses to take us to the track from school. The first bus will leave school a few

minutes after 9am and will take students from Years 3 to 6. Please be on time to school on the

day!

What to wear: Students may come dressed in their house colours. They should bring a warm jacket and can

also bring a blanket to wrap up in. Please name all clothing including the blanket.

What to bring: Students in Years 3 to 6 can bring their school bag with their snacks, lunch and drink bottles.

At the track: Students will sit in their house groups when not participating in an event and will be supervised

by teachers. Announcements will be made via the track's PA system for students to attend their events. They will also be given a card to pin to their top which shows their name, age group

and house and the events they are participating in.

Parents: Parents are very welcome to come along and watch / cheer and support but please DO NOT

cross onto the track or the infield at any stage. This is a request from track organisers and must

be adhered to for safety reasons.

**Event schedule:** A copy of the schedule for the day is included. Please understand that the times are a guide

only however we will try our best to be on time.

First Aid: Staff from Sports Aid First Aid Services will be assisting us with our first aid needs on the day.

**Getting home:** Buses will leave the track from 2.15pm to bring the Year 3 to 6 students back to school.

For students in Years 3 to 6, if you wish to take your child home directly from the track, <u>you</u>

MUST sign them out with Jackie Green at the track before you leave. The final roll will be taken as children board the buses. If you are making arrangements for another parent to collect your child, you will need to let us know with a note giving your permission for this to happen. This note must be handed to Jackie who will be stationed near the main administration building at the track.

The end of the day can be a busy time at the track. If you know you are going to take your child home yourself you can let Jackie know anytime during the day to assist with the congestion at signing out time.

# What's Happening In Our Classrooms

#### **Prep – Inquiry**

This term the prep-to-grade-2 cohort is looking at 'The Living World' through an Inquiry lens. We are specifically interested in the concept that living things have a variety of external features and live in different places where their basic needs are met. On Tuesday the students took part in an Insects and Minibeasts incursion in the multi-purpose room. We learnt about: the difference between a spider and an insect; invertebrates; and the importance of insects and minibeasts in our environment. We got to meet a wide range of creatures such as yabbies, burrowing cockroaches, hermit crabs, a blue-tongue lizard and more. The students got to pet most of the creatures (we left the tarantula and the scorpion well alone!) and had such an informative and engaging session.

#### Year 1/2 - Poetry

During the past three weeks, our Grade 1/2 students have been studying poetry. Their explorations covered three main streams: the poetic form, in which students identified how poems are constructed; poetic themes, in which students identified the reasons for writing and reading poetry; and poetic language, in which students considered the vocabulary of poems. Students wrote a suite of drafts covering a range of forms, before choosing their best work to put into their own book of poems.




#### Year 3/4 - Poetry


















Through these hands-on activities, students discovered why experimental outcomes might differ from theoretical predictions. It was a fun and insightful experience, and the kids learned a lot about probability along the way!

#### National Week of Deaf People (NWDP)

In the last week of term 3 Spotty students will be celebrating National Week of Deaf People (NWDP) in lieu of the actual week in the first week of the school holidays. NWDP is a week-long national celebration of Deaf individuals and the Australian Deaf community. We will have Deaf visitors sharing their language and stories, whole school performances and rotation activities.



#### What has been happening in the Auslan room this term?

The Grade 5/6 students have been learning that people from different places and backgrounds may use different languages and have ways of living and communicating that differ from their own.



Our Preps have been learning to sign the chorus of Enya's 'Sail Away', which they will be performing at the NWDP assembly at the end of term. This song uses lots of Depicting Signs where students show the movement of the boat, how the ropes are handled and the shape the sail forms as the wind catches it.









Did you know that 'Sail Away' will be signed by students from the Victorian College of the Deaf at the School Spectacular in September? All the Victorian schools taking part in the School Spectacular (including Spotty Primary) will be signing with VCD students. This will be an amazing sight to see and a great way to show inclusivity and how we value our Victorian Deaf community.



1/2 students have been learning to sign the song 'Happy and You Know It'. This song helps to showcase their learning of emotion signs and how matching facial expressions are used to support meaning. Students in Grades 1-6 can't wait to perform it for you at the NWDP assembly at the end of term!


