State Schools Spectacular

Families may be aware that we have a group of students participating in the Victorian State Schools Spectacular event next week. We are participating in the Mass Choir as part of a cast of almost 3,000 students from schools around Victoria. This is a large-scale performing arts event which will be performed to an audience of over 10,000 people and will be broadcast later in the year on Channel 7. The show includes choir, vocal, dance, drama and orchestra elements and we have been rehearsing since the start of the year.



Mrs Papafotiou and Ms O'Shea will be attending with the students, and it will be a very special event for this group of singers. I look forward to attending the afternoon performance and watching proudly from the audience at John Cain Arena before I head behind the scenes to assist with the backstage aspects of this big day.



What's Happening In Our Classrooms

Prep - Maths

In Maths, Prep students are currently exploring the notion of patterns. Patterns and their regularities are at the heart of mathematics, and to identify a pattern's repeating core is a fundamental skill. We are learning to recognise, copy, continue and create repeating patterns represented in different ways. These patterns could be made up of shapes, pictures, colours and/or numbers (to name a few), and we are having great fun creating and extending our own patterns.

Year 1/2 - Financial Maths

This week, the Grade 1/2 students have kicked off an exciting new unit on financial maths! We started by exploring Australian money, focusing on the unique features of different coins and notes. The students closely examined the size, shape, colour, and special details of each coin, such as the pictures and numbers. We noticed that silver coins represent cents, while gold coins represent dollars. The students have been practising how to order coins and notes by their value, rather than their size. We also introduced the concept that 100 cents equals \$1. The students have started to apply this idea to understand various dollar amounts, such as \$2 and \$3.












Year 3/4 - Maths - Mapping

This week in maths the students have been mapping. The students have been learning how to create and interpret maps using directional language, including words like 'left', 'right', 'up' and 'down'. The students put their knowledge to the test by using grid maps in order to find their partners' hidden treasure, and create their own Spotty School Map.

Year 5/6 - Picture Books

In our 5/6 classrooms, students have embarked on an exciting journey to design their own hybrid picture books, blending creativity with literacy skills. Each student has selected a unique combination of animals to inspire their hybrid character, which became the centrepiece of their narratives. To bring their books to life, students focused on designing their stories, paying close attention to details such as colour, character expressions, text placement and background settings. The inclusion of endpapers, a dedication and publication page have added a professional touch, allowing them to enhance the overall design of their books. By the end of the project, each student will publish a beautifully crafted picture book, complete with engaging text and captivating illustrations, ready for final publication and sharing with our broader audience.
